



INCOME AND SPENDING


Workers in Jackson County earn an average yearly household income of \$46,299. 35.8% of the households earn more than the national average each year. Household expenditures average \$47,173 per year. The majority of earnings get spent on Shelter, Transportation, Food and Beverages, Health Care, and Utilities.
